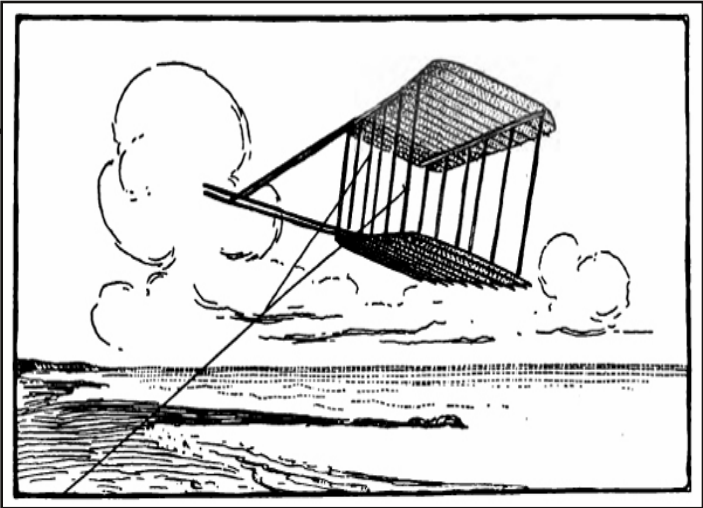
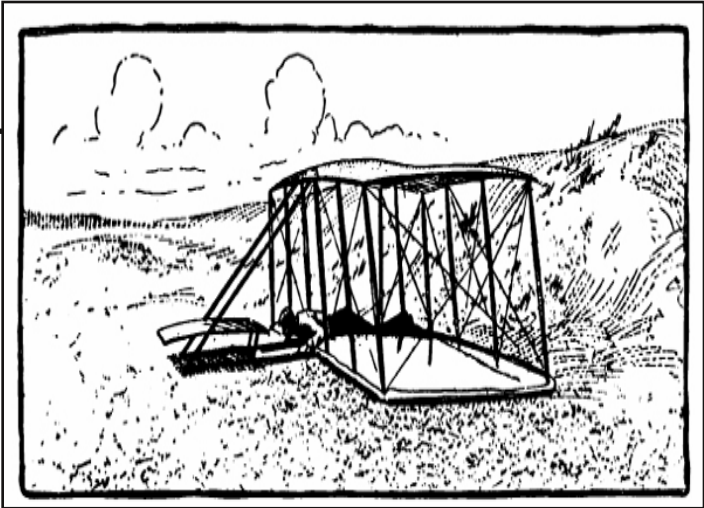


# First Wright Glider



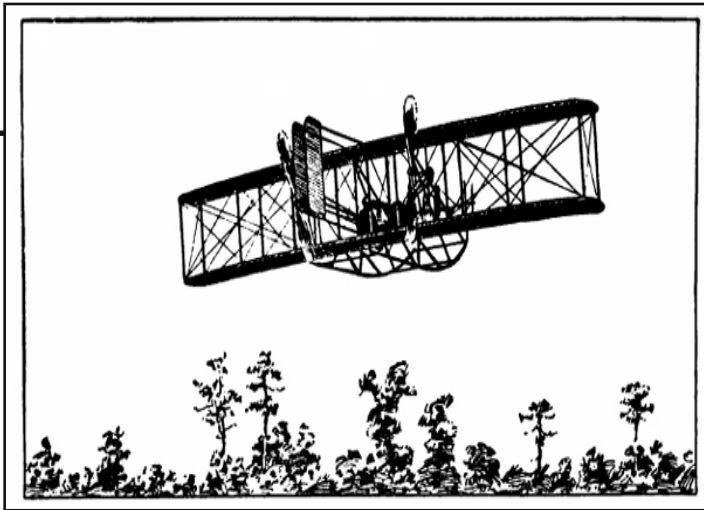

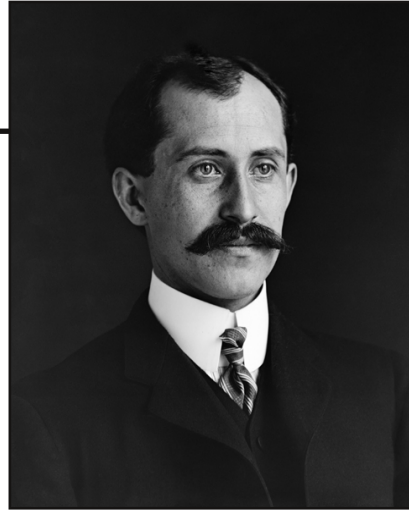

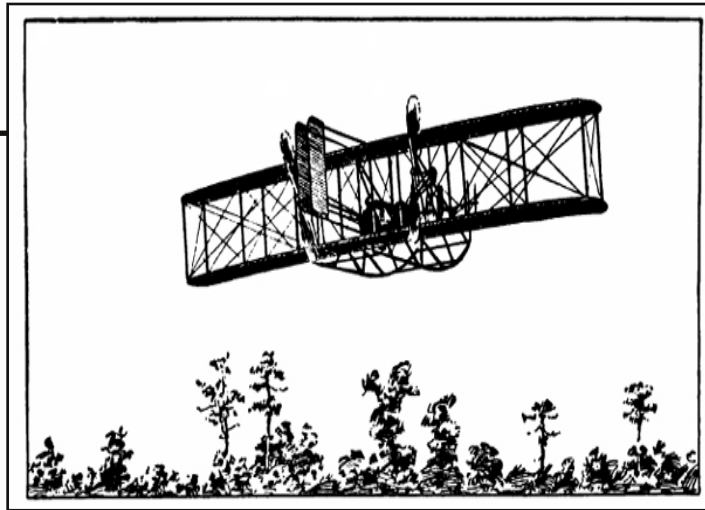
